A Word from Tony

Mathew 5:16 "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven."

Every once in a while we run into someone whose life richly glorifies the Lord. The Bible tells us in Matthew 7:16, "You shall know them by their fruits." The fruits are love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Chaplain Dennis Burrell went home to be with the Lord on May 11, 2006. He was the first chaplain I ever knew. I had been incarcerated for 12 years. I knew some men who had the title of Chaplain, but it was only a job description. There was no light and no fruit. Chaplain Burrell was so full of life and an open, honest joy, that you just wanted to be near him. He was the type of man that, while daily reaching for new heights, he would take you there with him. He had an open

door policy. Inmates filled his office to standing-room-only daily. He taught me to crawl, to walk, and to run. He taught me how to stand. He was my brother and my friend. Let me ask you a question, "What will they be saying about you when you are gone? Will they say your light shined the way to Jesus? Will they say you bore the fruit of the Holy Spirit?" More importantly, will you hear these words, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant."

Since our last letter, we are now blessed to be able to share a service at Jess Dunn Correctional Center on the second Monday of the month. We have also been able to go into the Tulsa Boys' Home in Sand Springs for the last two months on the fourth Sunday night. What a blessing to be able to speak into young peoples' lives.

Later in this newsletter, you will read a letter from a man at H-Block in Oklahoma State Penitentiary's supper maximum security unit in McAlester. There are also some pictures of our tent set up at Holdenville for Kairos Ministries "Family Day."

Thank you so much for your generous support. Your gifts make it possible to continue to minister at these locations. May God richly bless you.

A Word from Candy

Hello to everyone.

Most of you who are reading this newsletter probably know me very well. For those of you who don't, I would like to tell you about myself. Tony and I married at a very young age (16 and 17). We were definitely too young. We have two beautiful daughters who have grown up to be wonderful young women. When our girls were 5 and 6, their Dad was sent to prison, thus changing all of our lives. They never really knew what it was like having Dad at home. As the years followed, we were to spend many hours on the road to prisons and on the visiting yards of prisons. Life could be very trying at times, to say the least. I am not going to go into all of those details, but to any of your who may have loved ones that are incarcerated, I will say this, "Don't despair and don't give up. Just continue to love them and pray for them with your whole heart."

James 5:16 says, "Confess your trespasses to one another, and pray for

one another, that you may be healed. The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much." To me being healed means being whole. And being whole means being part of the kingdom of God. So continue to pray with all you have. Believe me, I spent many years praying for Tony.

Tony served 15 years in prison. Only the last four of those years were as a Christian. I am writing to say what a blessing it has been to our family since he has been saved. God not only answered my prayers for his salvation, but He is using Tony so greatly in His kingdom! I am so very proud. He is such a pillar of strength to his family now. It brings such peace that I can't even describe the difference. Even the last four years in prison were so much easier to bear. I didn't have to worry with each phone call that there would be bad news about Tony. I didn't have to worry about his drug issues or that visiting him would cause trouble to break out in the visiting room. The change in him even caused the guards' atti-

tudes towards me to be different. When we visited, we had such wonderful talks of the Lord. It was so cool! The last four years of prison went faster than any before. He has been home for 5 1/2 years now. These are the best years of our life ! We truly are best friends. God is so great!

Tony gets a lot of mail from men who are incarcerated. I don't always read every one. Some ask for prayer. Some just write to say "thank you." My heart is with those of you who are still doing time. You are in our prayers. I would like to say "thank you" to all of you who write. The letters of gratitude and encouragement for my Tony Mac just make my heart swell with pride. Many thanks to our loving Savior who is using him mightily. Thank you for taking time to give back to him! He needs your prayers, too. May our God in heaven bless you all.

I've witnessed many "hard heads" get excited about you coming on the radio on Saturdays, so I know you are penetrating hardened hearts where no other person would or even could. What God has and is still doing for you is not going unnoticed. Feed His sheep Brother, feed His

sheep!

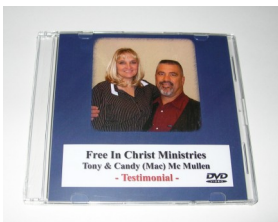
