A Word from Tony

Hello Friends,

In our last letter, I talked about Jesus giving Peter a commandment to feed his sheep. In Acts and Peter I and II, we read that Peter did just that. He is still feeding the Lord's sheep in God's word today.

It gives me great peace to know when God calls you, he also equips you with the tools and supplies that you will need for the journey.

When the Lord showed me at Joseph Harp Correctional Center that he was going to use me for prison ministry, I knew right then what my mission was. Candy and I were barely getting by, so I had no way to support a ministry. God was going to have to move "big time."

My wife and I began by doing all we could. We went through the orientation at Joseph Harp and got our badges. We started by going with other established prison ministries, "Hooked on Jesus" with Slim Crabtree, Benny Boeck Ministries, and "Prison Invasion" with Lonny Foster. As I went with these men to prisons and churches, God began to open doors at once. I was introduced to a little church named New Heart Fellowship in Broken Arrow, OK. Charlie and Sharon Jackson,

Pastor and First Lady, led a church full of loving people. There was such joy and a warm family fellowship. This Jesus Loving church became our church home.

Jesus began to move like only He can. He spoke to these people about helping us. Charlie gave us a ministry that was ready to go and the name of it was Free In Christ. AWESOME! People began giving money, and get this!...They ordained me and gave me a job as Associate Pastor over prison ministries. The giving increased and people began to get involved. Money was gathered for a tent, and then some men of the church got together and bought a truck and trailer to pull the tent. And it was

not just any old truck; it was a 2001 Dodge dualey. Another vehicle was purchased to drive volunteers to the prisons. FIC was up and running. We have a board of 20+ people and a volunteer list of 100, and growing. I was once asked if I pass the hat for an offering in prison. My answer was, "I would probably loose my hat!"

Thank God for people who don't look at my past. They don't see a convict, they see a convert. Last year we traveled 100,00 miles for the Lord. We have been able to take Bibles to those who need one, purchase clothing for released prisoners, help in finding housing, and purchase bus tickets for trips home. The prison chaplains have needs we can help with, everything from a new roof for the chapel to vacuum cleaners. The Word says that the greatest of needs is love. Because of the loving, giving hearts of our contributors, we are able to touch lives in many ways. Thank you so much from the very depth of our hearts. I can still hear the Lord saying, "Feed my sheep."

In your sermon you talked about getting a place ready for people getting out of prison with no place to go....I discharge (soon). I have no place to go and no family support. This has really been on my mind. When I heard you talk about Wings of Freedom, it put my mind to

rest....God has a place for me to go.


